



# **GRENADA DRUG EPIDEMIOLOGY NETWORK (GREN DEN)**

## **STATISTICAL REPORT OF INDICATORS**

**1 JANUARY TO 30 JUNE 2014**

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## **Introduction:**

### **Grenada Drug Epidemiology Network (GRENDEN)**

The Grenada Drug Epidemiology Network (GRENDEN) is the mechanism through which Grenada collects, analyzes, and disseminates information on drugs, and related information, for the purpose of monitoring trends, developing policy, and implementing appropriate programmes and responses. It is comprised of institutions which work in the area of drug control.

The objectives of GRENDEN are:

- i. To provide accurate, relevant and timely statistical data on the nature and extent of the drug situation in Grenada;
- ii. To increase coordination, dialogue, and cooperation among the institutions which work in the area of drug control, through the exchange of drug-related statistical information;
- iii. To inform policy makers and the general public on drug trends and related matters.

GRENDEN, formerly known as GRENDIN, was established on 11 December 2002, and endorsed by Cabinet, effective 22 December 2002.

The Drug Control Secretariat is the National Observatory on Drugs in Grenada. It performs the administrative functions of GRENDEN.

### **Indicators**

Twelve (12) Indicators comprise the *GRENDIN Statistical Report of Indicators*. The Report is published biannually.

Appendix 1 contains a list of the twelve Indicators.

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## **Analysis of Data Obtained from GRENDEN Indicators**

The following are key findings of the GRENDEN Statistical Report of Indicators, 1 January to 30 June 2014.

### **Drug Consumption**

- i. No studies were conducted on the prevalence of drug use.

### **Drug Production**

- i. The Royal Grenada Police Force (RGPF) seized 20.71 kg of cocaine and 7,546 units of cannabis plants.

### **Consequences of Drugs**

- i. Data from the Criminal Records Office of the RGPF indicated that 329 persons were arrested for drug related offences; this number comprised of 311 males (95 %) and 18 females (5%).
- ii. Sixteen (16) or 5% of persons arrested were within the age range 15 to 19 years.
- iii. The main offence for which persons were arrested was possession of drugs.
- iv. Three (3) firearms were seized in relation to narcotrafficking.
- v. Ninety four (94) persons were admitted to the Mt. Gay Psychiatric Unit for problems derived from the consumption of drugs. Fifty (50%) of the persons were admitted for psychiatric and behavioral disorders due to the use of cannabinoids.
- vi. Twenty seven persons were sentenced to Her Majesty's Prisons for drug-related offences. They were all males. This number comprised twenty five (25) Grenadians and two (2) Vincentians.
- vii. Six (6) persons, all males were deported to Grenada from Canada and the United States of America for criminal offences.
- viii. One hundred and eighteen (118) persons were convicted for drug-related offences. One hundred and sixteen (116) or 98% were males and two (2) or 2 % females.

### **Results of Policy and/or Program Responses**

- i. There were no requests made by, or received by Grenada in money laundering cases for the period under review.

- ii. Two hundred and eighty four (284) samples of cocaine and one hundred and thirty six (136) samples of marijuana were tested by the Produce Chemist Laboratory for the presence of drugs. All tests were positive.

## Data Reported By Thematic Areas

### 1. Drug Consumption

#### *i. Magnitude of Drug Consumption*

No studies were conducted on the prevalence of drug use. However, the findings of the Third Secondary Schools' Drug Prevalence Survey, which was conducted in 2013, were published.

#### *ii. Extent, Patterns and Trends in Drugs*

The primary drugs consumed were cannabis and crack/cocaine. No new drugs or new patterns of use was detected, neither was any new groups of drug users identified.

The prices of drugs remained same as in 2013.
