INTRODUCTION: Grenada Drug Information Network (GRENDIN)

The Grenada Drug Information Network (GRENDIN) is the mechanism through which Grenada coordinates the collection and dissemination of drug-related statistical information and other relevant information. It is comprised of institutions which work in the area of drug control. The objectives of GRENDIN are: to provide accurate, relevant and timely statistical data on the nature and extent of the drug situation in Grenada; to increase coordination, dialogue, and cooperation among the institutions which work in the area of drug control, through the exchange of drug-related statistical information; to inform policy makers and the general public on drug trends and related matters. GRENDIN was formally endorsed by cabinet in December 2002.

The Drug Control Secretariat is the national observatory on drugs in Grenada. It performs the administrative functions of GRENDIN.

GRENDIN Indicators

The statistical data presented in this report, represents information collected by various Ministries/Departments and reported in the GRENDIN *Questionnaire of Indicators*. Eleven (11) Indicators were used to compile the data.

- i. Admissions; Rathdune Psychiatric Unit
- ii. Admissions; Carlton House
- iii. Admissions; General Hospital
- iv. Control of Pharmaceutical Products, Pharmacy Unit
- v. Seizures; Customs and Excise Department
- vi. Seizures, Arrests, Court Cases, Convictions; Criminal Records Office
- vii. Criminal Deportees; Criminal Investigation Department
- viii. Financial Crimes; Financial Intelligence Unit
- ix. Firearms, Ammunition, Explosives, Other Related Materials; Royal Grenada Police Force
- x. Incarcerations; Prisons

(1) This indicator refers to public officials who commit a corruption offense related to illicit drug trafficking, for example, judges or law enforcement agents receiving bribes from drug traffickers so as not to arrest or sentence those criminals.

(2) Acts of Corruption are those identified in Articles VI, VIII, IX, and XI of the Inter-American Convention against Corruption:

1. The solicitation or acceptance by a government official of a bribe (Art. VI.a)
2. The offering or granting to a government official of a bribe (Art. VI.b)
3. Any act or omission by a government official for the purpose of illicitly obtaining benefits for himself or for a third party (Art. VI.c)
4. The fraudulent use or concealment of property derived from an act of corruption (Art. VI.d)
5. Transnational bribery of a government official (Art. VIII).
6. Illicit enrichment of a government official (Art. IX)
7. The improper use by a government official of classified or confidential
8. Embezzlement by a government official (Art. XI.1.b)

(3) Illicit drug trafficking is as referred to in Article 3, paragraphs 1 and 2 of the 1988 U.N. Convention. Generally speaking this means possession for the purpose of trafficking, cultivation, production (including manufacturing and processing), import/export, distribution and sale.
