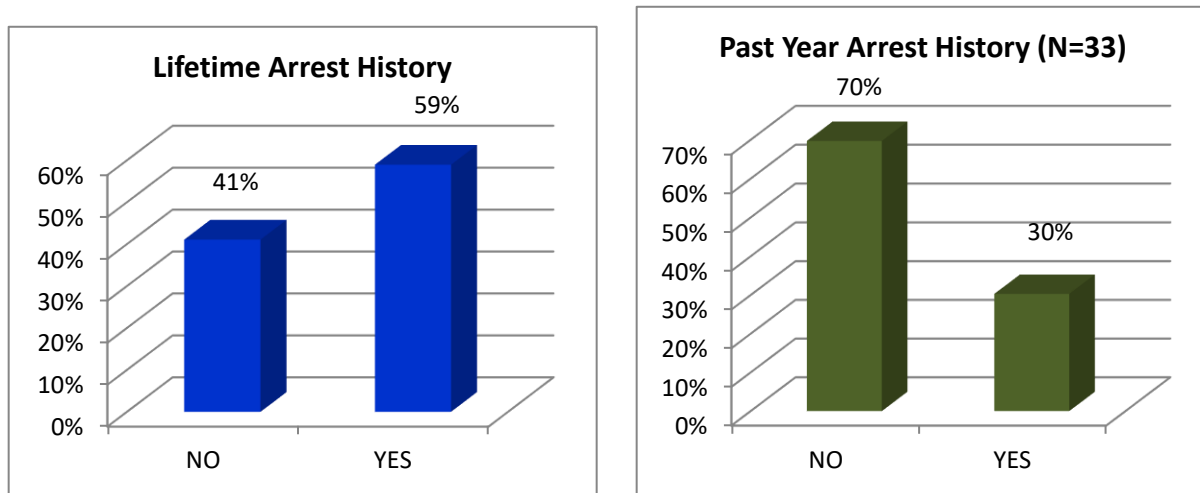




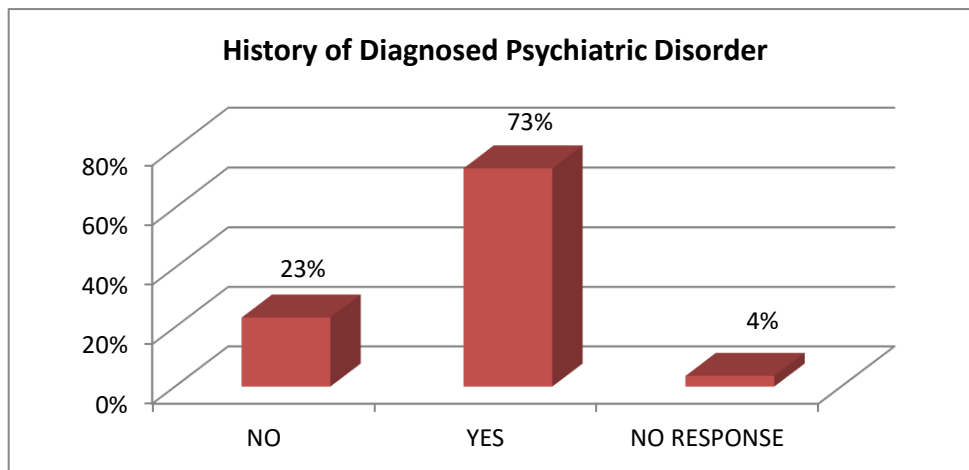
According to data collected in 2016 from treatment centers in Grenada, fifty-nine (59) percent of persons in treatment for marijuana use were arrested at least once in their lifetime, while 30% were arrested at least once in 2016. Seventy-three (73) % of people in treatment for that same time period were also diagnosed with a psychiatric disorder. These results were published in the report on characteristics of persons seeking treatment for problematic drug use in Grenada.

Seventy-three (73) percent of the population in treatment for marijuana use were diagnosed with a psychiatric disorder. The report did not seek to determine the correlation between the two.
