Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria are: 1) Core areas of business, geographic areas of operation, year of incorporation, etc.

- 2) Previous projects where your company has successfully provided high-level advisory services to governments

- 3) Previous projects your company has successfully completed that have had an eGovernment advisory service component.
- 4) Previous projects that your company has successfully completed that have had a tax administration component.
- 5) Experience working with the World Bank procurement process either in tax administration contexts or in other areas. **Key Experts will not be evaluated at the shortlisting stage.**

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" July ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications, but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Quality and Cost Based Selection method set out in the Procurement Regulations.
